Adobe Illustrator is an essential tool to take your creative sketches and illustrations to the digital world. It is the first tool to learn to be able to create digital illustrations, icons, user interfaces (UI), web sites and more. Illustrator courses are in two main levels: Beginners and Advanced. These courses will prepare you on both academic and professional levels to use the software to plan, develop, and integrate vector graphics in creative practice.

This Advanced course prepare you for the Adobe Certified Associate (ACA) exam through a hands-on approach. You will be introduced to advanced Graphic Design & Illustration Using Adobe Illustrator. You will be introduced to the ACA exam, cover its different aspects and break the ice through several practical questions. This course will help you put your creative ideas into action by integrating theory and practice into tasks that prepare you for your future career in digital graphics.

### How will this course prepare you for your study?

The module delivery will be broken down into the required 36 hours of contact time. Utilising the ALF framework and a blended approach to delivery. 3 hours per week over 6 weeks face to face (either on campus or online) and 3 hours per week over six weeks of online practical content.
