Module aims

Adobe Illustrator is an essential tool to take your creative sketches and illustrations to the digital world. It is the first tool to learn to be able to create digital illustrations, icons, user interfaces (UI), web sites and more. Illustrator courses are in two main levels: Beginners and Advanced. These courses will prepare you on both academic and professional levels to use the software to plan, develop, and integrate vector graphics in creative practice.

This essential level course allows you to explore Adobe Illustrator through a hands-on approach. You will be introduced to Visual Design Using Adobe Illustrator basic tools and features. This course will help you put your creative ideas into action by integrating theory and practice into tasks that prepare you for your future career in digital graphics.

Certification

This module will prepare you for the Advanced module. Both essential and advanced modules will prepare you for the Adobe certification exam. You will learn using a hands-on practice that merges both theory and practice related to creating vector graphics. The course will be based on tasks that you are expected to have in your future career as a graphic designer.
